I walked the last proposed re-walk that was done with you, Jen n and myself with the intent to begin brushing the rough tread. In doing so I noticed that the stopping or turn around point of the first major switchback is probably 30-40yds

short of where it needs to be to allow for a much more sustainable overall grade. We could do the original walk line, but we would end up with a significantly steeper grade, so less sustainable.

I would recommend we look at extending the line, but I know that there is some sensitivity to that.

Do you think we should pursue the extra yardage? Or Stick with what we've got?

The point that we previously decided on could work, but it doesn't entirely solve the erosion issue.
